Introducing AP Business with Personal Finance

- Teach students the fundamentals of how businesses create value, how organizations compete in the marketplace, and how business leaders make decisions.
- Deliver insight into the forces driving customers, whether they are other businesses or families.
- Expand opportunities for high school students from all backgrounds to access engaging, college-level work that will deliver career-ready knowledge and skills.
- Launch in the 2026-27 school year with the AP Exam for college credit and an industry-recognized credential.

Hands-On Learning, Lifelong Opportunity

The AP Business with Personal Finance course will connect students to real-world skills essential for today's economy, setting them apart when applying for job opportunities with:

- Smart and relevant lessons on how companies work, how to make wise financial decisions, and how to thrive in the modern economy.
- Practical, project-based learning where students solve business challenges and develop critical thinking.
- A career-focused course framework designed for the CTE Business Pathway and to meet graduation requirements for personal finance.

From the Classroom to the Workplace

The course will be supported in the coming years by initiatives that expand AP Business with Personal Finance course impact beyond the classroom, including:

- Opportunities like business competitions to inspire students to develop and pitch entrepreneurial ideas.
- Distinguishing students when they apply for internships and apprenticeships and building a foundation for accelerated on-the-job learning.

- Advocating for financial literacy instruction in high schools to ensure personal finance education is accessible nationwide.
